Improving Attendance across the school:

Well done to Year 6 Yellow for achieving 100%. The overall percentage for the whole school was 95%, which is well below expectation. The key reasons for this poor attendance are holidays and travel abroad during term- time and the poor attendance of the Reception classes. Our target for this year is 96%. Please let's all continue to work together every week and try harder to reach our target! The lowest attenders are currently 2 Green with 85%. This is a real cause for concern.

Parents, please make every effort for your children to attend regularly.

Poor Attendance: I am so very concerned about the poor attendance of a great many of our children, as it is the lowest that it has ever been across the school! All parents of children whose attendance is below 90% will be receiving weekly calls from a senior member of staff. Where necessary, the Education Welfare Officer, will also undertake home visits. Please make every effort to have your child in school daily for the remainder of this term.





<u>Themed Lunch</u> " <u>Green Fingers- CENSUS Day"- Thursday</u> <u>19th May 2022</u>

THE BIG PLASTIC COUNT: Get involved!

Greenpeace have launched a NATIONAL initiative to count how much plastic we throw away as a nation.

You can get involved by adding your plastic waste to the count. A tally sheet is attached to the newsletter for you to print off. Or please collect a sheet from the school office. HOW DO YOU COUNT?: For 7 days, you need to count every single piece of plastic packaging waste that you throw away - that's plastic waste that you put in the bin and plastic you put in the recycling. Try to count anything you throw away while out of the home too.

Some people like to tally up each piece of plastic as they go along, whereas others find it easier to save up all of their plastic over the course of the day or week (storing it in a bag or box) and then tally it up in one go - it's totally up to you which you do!
