Improving Attendance across the school:

Well done to Year 6R,6B & 6Y for achieving 98.9%. The overall percentage for the whole school was 90.7%, which is well below expectation. The key reasons for this poor attendance are holidays and travel abroad during term- time and the poor attendance of the Reception classes. Our target for this year is 96%. Please let's all continue to work together every week and try harder to reach our target! The lowest attenders are currently Reception Red with 77.4%. This is a real cause for concern.

Parents, please make every effort for your children to attend regularly. Especially those of you with children in Reception.

Remember- Good attendance=good self esteem= good progress

Late Arrivals In The Morning: Please ensure your child gets into school on time by 8.50am. The doors leading to the classrooms through the main playground close at 9.00am, as registers close at 9.05am. Any children who arrive later than 9am will need to make their way to the school office and be signed in to receive their attendance mark. It is vital that your child arrives on time, so that the school is able to carry out our safeguarding procedures promptly in the mornings. Please ensure, you also do not drop your child at school too early as there is no supervision.

The school office must be made aware of all absences by 8.45am. This is vital so that the school is able to carry out safeguarding checks

Holiday Requests: We are having an increased number of requests for pupils to take holidays out of school times to visit families overseas or attend functions following the lockdown period. Whilst I am sympathetic to being away from family and friends for the pandemic period, please remember that the school cannot authorise these holidays as we have 13 weeks of holiday time to plan these in. ESPECIALLY after the lockdown period, it is vital that we now ensure as much consistency in learning for all pupils-best facilitated by being in school every day. Every minute of learning is precious!

SATs Week

If your child is in Year 6, please ensure that he/she arrives in school on time each day, as the tests will begin promptly.

KS1 SATs will take place over the next 2 weeks. However these tests will be in groups without a time limit and judgements will be supported by teacher assessment.

<u>Queen's Jubilee Celebration- Friday 27th May 2022-Non-</u> Uniform Day




There will be a party for all the children. Please bring in a small snack clearly labelled with your child's name. A $\pounds 1$ donation will also be greatly appreciated
